September

A, B, C, D, Color - Red, Shapes- Circle – no sides,
Numbers 1,2,3,4. Learn about the class room rules and routines.

October

E, F, G, H, Color – Yellow, Shape – Oval – no sides,
Numbers 5,6,7,8. Learn about the Hygiene and Five Senses

November

I, J, K, L, Color - blue, Triangle – three sides
Numbers 9,10,11,12. Learn about the body (self), bones etc.

December

M, N, O, Color – red & yellow makes Orange,
Shape - Square - four sides, Numbers 13,14,15.
Learn about the Families and their Culture

January

P, Q, R, S, Color – red and blue makes purple, Shape - Rectangle - four sides
Numbers 16,17,18,19. Learn about Kansas

February

T, U, V, W, Color – yellow and blue makes green,
Shape - Diamond - four sides, Numbers 20,21,22,23.
Learn about the different kind of houses that we live in, houses in different
countries, etc.

March

X, Y, Z, and Color – white and black makes gray,
Shape -Pentagon– five sides, Numbers 24 & 25.
Learn about the United States of America

April

Shape - Hexagon - six sides,
Revising A to M, Numbers 1 to 12, Community and Community workers

May

Revising N to Z, Numbers 13 to 25, Universe (planets, etc.)
